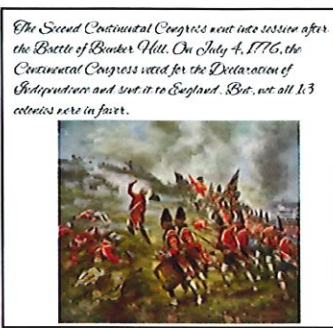
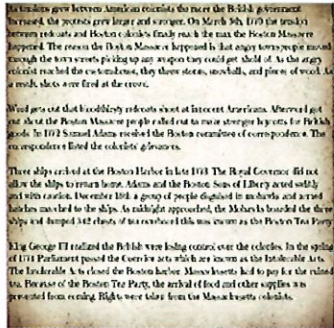
First Graders End Up Eating Their Math Lesson!

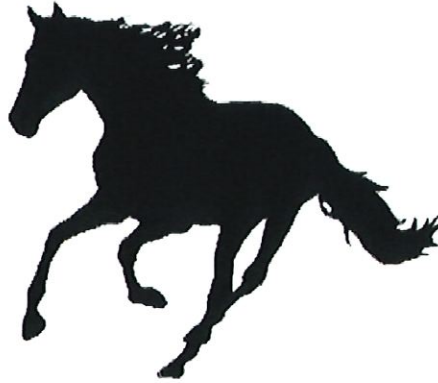
