\*\*\*Due to the decrease in past summer school enrollment, Linn County R-I is trying to determine whether summer school will be offered this summer based on student interest. If your child/children plan on attending summer school, please send this form back by April 14th. This date is important because we will need a count to determine whether summer school is feasible or not.

Sign up now. Summer school will focus on Reading and Math, but other fun activities will also be incorporated into summer school. Summer school will begin on Wednesday, May 24th and end on Tuesday, June 13th. NO SCHOOL on Monday, May 29th (Memorial Day).

The students will attend school from 8:00 a.m. to 12:00 p.m. each day with the exception of **Tuesday, June 13<sup>th</sup>**. On that day, we will travel to Chillicothe to play in the park, eat lunch, and then swim at the Chillicothe Aquatic Center. We will return around 4:00 p.m. that day. Summer school is an option for students entering Kindergarten – 5<sup>th</sup> grade.

Report changes, like a new address, to the Family Support Division





# **Developmental Screening**



### **Child development**

As children grow, they need to reach important developmental milestones. Developmental milestones are a set of skills or age-specific tasks that most children can do during a certain age range. Each child is unique and may reach milestones at a varying pace. Reaching milestones at the typical age during infancy and early childhood helps families and Early Care and Education professionals know a child is developing as expected. For example, taking a first step, waving "bye," or saying simple words like "mama" are all important developmental milestones.

### What is developmental screening?

A developmental screening is a formal process using a tool to see if a child is meeting developmental milestones. Screening tools have questions to help identify possible delays that may need further evaluation. It is completed by a healthcare provider, parent educator, or early childhood professional in collaboration with parents/legal guardians.

### Why should a child have a developmental screening?

Developmental screenings provide a quick look at the child's current development. It can provide a picture of the child's strengths and any areas of need. Developmental screenings can measure a child's general development as early as one month old which assists in early intervention. The American Academy of Pediatrics (AAP) recommends developmental screenings for all children during regular well-checks at 9, 18, and 30 months. Screenings should occur every year until kindergarten entry.

If parents/legal guardians are worried at any time about their child's development, they should talk with their child's healthcare provider, parent educator, or early childhood professional. Parents/legal guardians know their child best. Acting early can make a difference in a child's learning and development.

### How can a child receive a developmental screening?

Parents/legal guardians can request a developmental screening from a healthcare provider or connect with a trained early childhood professional who can provide a screening through a child care center, preschool or community based program, or local school district parent education program.

# What should parents/legal guardians do with the results of their child's developmental screening?

Once the screening is completed, parents/legal guardians should have an opportunity to review the screening results. This can be done with a child's healthcare provider, parent educator, or early childhood professional. Results from the screening can assist parents/legal guardians in learning how to continue to help their child meet developmental milestones. It also allows the opportunity for parents/legal guardians to work together to find resources or services that encourage continued growth and prepare for school readiness.
