#### 7th Grade Science Exploration

The Linn County seventh graders had an eventful week before going on Thanksgiving break. On Wednesday, Alisha Ehrich from the Linn County Health Department visited with the group about the effects that smoking has on a person's health. Ms. Ehrich brought a set of healthy lungs and a set of lungs that have been damaged due to smoking for the students to see and feel during the presentation.

On Thursday, the class then had an opportunity to take a trip to A.T. Still University in Kirksville and visit a few of their facilities. The visit included a tour of the A.T. Still museum, the dental school lab and the patient simulation lab.

The tour of the museum was hosted by the curator of the museum, Jason Haxton, who is also the author of the book "The Dibbuk Box". At the museum, students learned about the life and history of Andrew Taylor Still who is the founding father of the field of osteopathic medicine. Students were able to view a replica of the Still family cabin, a replica of the first osteopathic school and a series of medical tools that have been used over the years. One of the museum's most notable exhibits is a complete dissection of the human nervous system. There are only four of these in existence with two of the dissections having taken place at ATSU and one of them remaining in the museum.

The next stop on the tour was the ATSU Dental Lab. The dental lab was completed in 2013 and saw their first graduating class in 2017. In this lab, dental students are able to learn many techniques from basic cleanings and taking x-rays to completing fillings and impressions.

The last stop of the tour was the patient simulation lab. The lab contains a series of exam rooms, each with a high functioning computerized mannequin. The mannequins provide the opportunity for students to

interact with a simulated "patient" by taking vitals, asking questions about their symptoms and eventually coming up with a diagnosis. The simulation lab is also used for training by members of Kirksville medical professionals, the fire department and the ambulance crew. The students all agreed that the hands-on simulation was the highlight of the tour.


