High School Homecoming Royalty

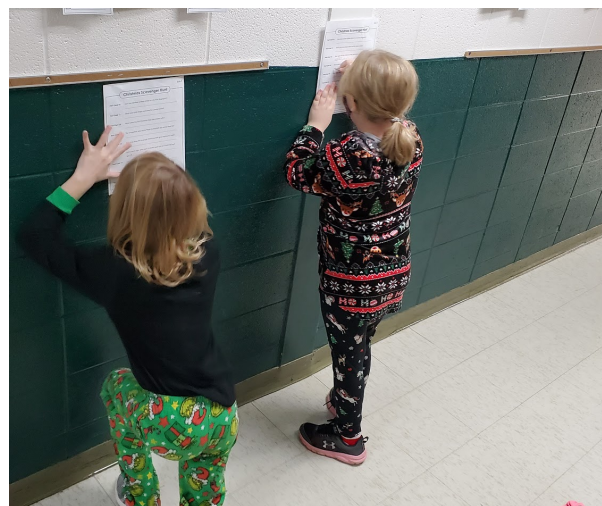
