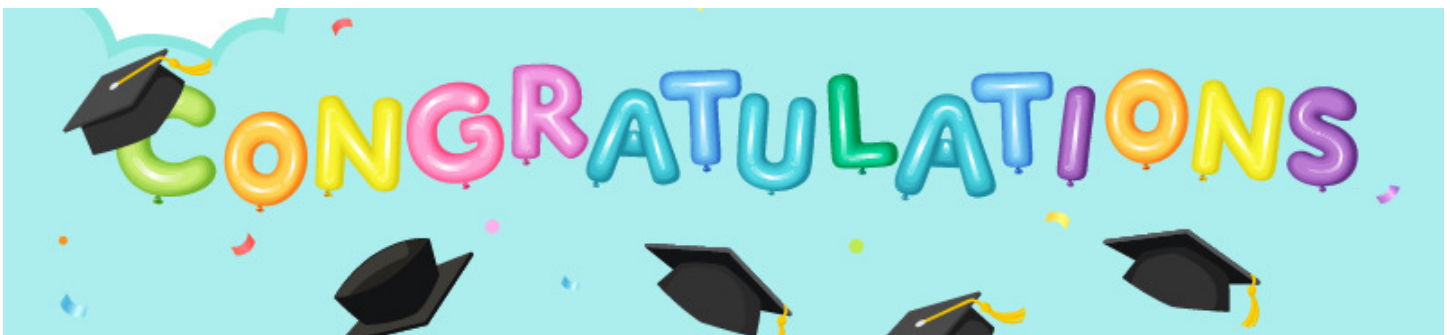

Four Day School Week for the 2019-2020 School Year

Another great school year has ended and what a year it was. It was definitely a year to remember with the High School basketball team making it to the “State Playoffs”, track records being broken, accomplishing 1:1 Chromebooks in the school, focusing on academic achievement through the MMD (Missouri Model District) statewide grant and refinishing the gym floor with the Mustang at center court, etc. Now that school has ended it is time to start focusing on the 2019-2020 school year. The biggest change taking place for next year is that Linn Co. R-1 School will join 60 other districts in the state by going to a 4-day school week. We will be one of three other districts in our conference that has adopted a 4-day school week calendar.

I appreciate each of the parents/guardians, students and staff who completed the survey giving the school district feedback on making this transition. We had over 80% of parent/guardian votes in favor of going to a 4-day school week. There will be a few changes taking place with this new framework; we will learn as we go and use other districts who have been following this model for over 8 years. Students will attend school Tuesday through Friday. The school day will increase slightly, with the start of the day being 8:00 a.m. and dismissal time being 3:37 p.m. for elementary and 3:40 p.m. for JH and HS. The bus pick-up times will change very little with the afternoon routes seeing the biggest change in time. All planned activities will take place as they have in the past, such as athletic competitions, Vo-tech, etc. We will have Professional Development on Mondays for staff members, with only two early outs during the entire year. If the weather would happen to be as persistent as it was this year, other Mondays will be used as make-up days as well.
