From the Library

Frequently asked questions (with answers):

How long may students have books? 21 school days

How much are library fines? 5 cents per school day

What is the largest fine that one book can accumulate? \$3.00 per book How often do students have library? K-5 students have library once a week for one period. Jr. High-HS students can checkout before and after school.

How many books can a students check out? Lower elementary students may have two to three books on their record at one time. Older students, according to class needs.

How can I keep my child from getting a fine? Students may renew their books any time, even without the book at school.

What if my child loses a book? If a book is lost, you may pay for it at replacement cost. That transaction is recorded on your child's computer record. If you find the book later, the money is returned. We cannot allow you to replace books from Amazon, etc., due to the binding quality.

What is Accelerated Reader? AR is a computerized quiz program. Students read books, then take computer quizzes to test their knowledge of the books. Quarterly rewards are given. The goals per class are as follows:



2nd=6 pts; 3rd=8 pts; 4th=10 pts; 5th=12 pts; 6th=15 pts; 7th=18 pts; 8th=20 pts; 9th=24

pts; 10th=26 pts; 11th=28 pts; 12th=30 pts. Beginning this year, Grades 2-5 will receive a library grade each quarter based on the number of Accelerated Reader points accumulated.

Substitute Bus Drivers Needed

Linn County R-I is in need of substitute bus drivers. If you are aware of anyone that would be of interest please have them contact Mr. Livingston at 244-5045.

Substitute drivers are paid based upon the number of times that they drive a bus. While the frequency of driving can vary, it is a nice additional source of income that works well for farmers, stay at home mom's, and self-employed individuals who are free to drive on a flexible schedule.

Substitute bus drivers are typically the first in line when a new permanent bus driver is hired. So being a substitute driver can lead to a more permanent position if desired.

Drivers must be 21 years of age, and be able to receive a CDL license with the Class "S" endorsement, and pass a physical examination. The district will reimburse individuals for the time related to taking the driving test, will pay for the costs of the driving test, the criminal background check and the physical, In addition the district will provide assistance in studying for the driving test.

A school bus driver has a unique relationship with the students. It is an important responsible position that can not be left to just anyone. We need strong community members to help in this important educational role. For application or more information call 244-5045.
